War in Ukraine Impacts an Already Struggling Zimbabwe

Despite the thousands of miles between them, conflict in Ukraine is still affecting millions of people in Zimbabwe—a low-income, landlocked country in South Africa.

With the cost of basic necessities, such as food and medication, at an all-time high, struggling communities are finding it even more difficult to provide for their families. Due to erratic weather patterns, the COVID pandemic, and now price hikes caused by inflated shipping rates, the World Food Program (WFP) estimates that 7.7 million Zimbabweans are facing food insecurity.

According to the Council on Foreign Relations, “All of these developments, compounded by...global disruptions arising from Russia’s invasion of Ukraine, have left Zimbabwe’s young people suffering. Finding themselves in the midst of grinding poverty...”

Around the world, rising gas prices have caused major stutters in shipping and travel alike, contributing to the already stifling pressure put on crucial supply chains and making it increasingly difficult for companies to transport their goods, especially to hard-to-reach locations like Zimbabwe.

Despite this, Logenix continues to provide necessary supplies to the countries that so desperately need them. From medication to infrastructure materials to food, our dedicated teams continue to ensure these supplies arrive on time and on budget.



Thanks to our innovative management solutions we have been able to implement cost-effective, alternative remedies that allow us to continue to operate even in times of uncertainty and crisis. Recently, Logenix teams succeeded in delivering over 12,500 tons of rice to Zimbabwe as part of an international food assistance program. This massive order was broken down into two separate ocean freight shipments due to limited warehousing in Zimbabwe. Each shipment contained 50kg bags packed into 1mt bags for easier handling and distribution to communities desperately in need.



Continuing Aid to War-Torn Ukraine

A country still in turmoil, its people struggling under the weight of uncertainty and desperation...

As war rages on in Ukraine, our teams work harder than ever to grow our relief capabilities within the country itself and in the surrounding Central European regions.

As the industry leader in navigating regions under conflict, Logenix staff applies 'lessons learned' from extensive involvement in conflict areas like Bosnia, Iraq, Afghanistan, South Sudan, Syria, and Yemen to name just a few. This hard-earned experience is crucial to understanding what it takes to safely navigate war-ravaged countries.

Consistent with our position as the industry leader in managing medicines and medical supplies throughout the developing world, Logenix is leading the provision of critical pharma supplies to Ukraine. Within just a few weeks of the outset of the conflict, millions of dollars of life-saving medicines, test kits, and a wide range of personal protective equipment (PPE) were being managed into the region. Pioneering the use of the Polish free zone set up by Rządowa Agencja Rezerw Strategicznych (RARS) Logenix was getting critical supplies across the border by early April. As the operational theatre evolved, we were able to navigate the new bureaucratic requirements and to partner with savvy local operators to deliver supplies directly into Ukraine; safely, on budget, and on time.

Managing supplies from all over the world, utilizing both air and ocean capabilities, the flow of critical supplies into the region—including managed deliveries deep into Ukraine—has been consistent. In just the past four months, Logenix has successfully delivered dozens of air shipments and ocean containers valued over \$21 million USD.

Today, reliable and proactive supply chain management by Logenix continues to deliver millions of dollars of medicines and supplies into Ukraine on a weekly basis.
